## 1989 LANCIA DELTA HF 4WD INTEGRALE 16V



The first Delta (*Tipo 831*) was a five-door <u>hatchback</u>, designed by <u>Giorgetto Giugiaro</u> and released in 1979. Between 1980 and 1982, it was also sold in Sweden, Denmark and Norway by <u>Saab Automobile</u>, <u>badged</u> as the "Saab-Lancia 600" to replace the retired <u>96</u> model. The Delta was voted the 1980 European Car of the Year.

A special *Delta HF Integrale* version was a <u>four-wheel drive</u> <u>hot hatch</u> with a <u>turbocharged petrol</u> <u>engine</u>. Modified versions of the HF dominated the World Rally Championship, scoring <u>46 victories</u> <u>overall</u> and winning the <u>Constructors' Championship</u> a record six times in a row from <u>1987</u> to <u>1992</u>, in addition to <u>Drivers' Championship</u> titles for <u>Juha Kankkunen</u> (1987 and <u>1991</u>) and <u>Miki</u> <u>Biasion</u> (1988 and <u>1989</u>).

The <u>Lancia Delta S4</u>, which the works team ran immediately prior to the HF 4WD and Integrale models' world championship careers from the season-ending <u>1985 RAC Rally</u> until the end of the <u>1986 season</u>, while sharing the same name and appearance, was a <u>Group B</u> race car designed and built specifically for <u>rallying</u>, and was entirely different from the mass-produced consumer versions.
